Phil Phifer was declined. Your attendance is requested. Circuit visitor the Rev. Charles Burhop will again conduct the call meeting.

WEEKLY WORSHIP SCHEDULE CHANGES

Beginning with the Nov. 30 service, St. John and Immanuel will have **ONE SHARED service per week**, due to the departure of Pastor Phil Phifer. His last service with us will be the Thanksgiving Eve service, Nov. 27 at 7 p.m. Since a full-time vacancy pastor has not been found, that means some changes for us. The circuit visitor and regional administrator were unable to find a vacancy pastor to devote his time exclusively to our congregations.

Out of necessity, our weekly worship will be a joint service of the two congregations with Immanuel, Moltke each week on Saturday at 5pm only.

This arrangement begins with the Nov. 30 worship service at Immanuel. **There will be no Sunday worship at either congregation at least through December.** The Saturday, Dec. 7 worship service will be at St. John; Saturday, Dec. 14 at Immanuel; Saturday, Dec. 21 at St. John; and Saturday, Dec. 28 at Immanuel and so on. Pastor J. Derek Riddle has agreed to conduct these services, but he is not available on Sunday mornings unless we go to an 8am or 1pm service. The leadership of both churches decided that Saturday at 5pm was a better option than the early or late Sunday time periods. If the majority says otherwise, we can consider a change.

Pastor Riddle will call on shut-ins, participate in school chapel services and attend meetings as his time allows. He will welcome confirmation students to attend his classes at Peace Lutheran Church each Sunday at 11 a.m. Sunday school will continue at both churches at the usual times, unless noted. Some details are up in the air, but we welcome your suggestions and encouragement.

Advent services are planned as follows: Dec. 4 at St. Johns; Dec. 11 at Immanuel; Dec. 18 at Peace. Christmas Eve service at Immanuel is at 4pm; St. John children's service is Christmas Eve at 5pm and Christmas Day service is at 9:30am at Peace.

These are all necessary changes as we face the challenge of a vacancy. The changes, and lack of a Sunday worship service, is not ideal, but the best way to fill our current need. Should a vacancy pastor be found, schedules may again change. We have to be flexible. Patience and prayer, are what they suggest we use to get through this trying time.

It is important that you continue to support the church with your time, talents and treasures as we go through this transition period. Offerings given by members of St. John while attending Immanuel will go to St. John and vice-versa. We need to work through this together and stay strong as a congregation.


Christmas Outreach Tree


