Dear St. John's Congregation,

Today, Wednesday June 10th, Chairman of the Deacon's Willard Brege called a special meeting of the Deacon's along with Church Officers and Pastor Riddle to discuss a safe protocol for the Return to Worship Service. Below is what you can expect when we resume Worship Services this Sunday, June 14th:

1. Just a note, for the time being there will only be a Sunday morning service at 8am. To clarify there will not be a Saturday evening Service.

2. Doors will be propped open so no need to touch the handles.

3. Deacon's will be on hand to instruct you as to hand sanitizer available and will instruct you as to where to sit. Families may sit together, however we will utilize both sides of The Church and sections will be marked off to ensure proper social distancing. Please be conscious of social distancing practicing and hand shakes, hugs will be discouraged.

4. Prayer requests can be filled out and given to a Deacon to be relayed to Pastor.

5. The use of masks are encouraged when entering, exiting or moving around in the Church. If you would like to or need to remove your mask when you are seated you are welcome to do so, the same can be said if for some medical reason you cannot wear a mask.

6. Collection plates will be located near the entrances to the Sanctuary so you can place your offering while entering or exiting Church.

7. Service folders will be placed in the pews. Service folders will include the complete worship service to include the hymns. Hymnals and fellowship folders will be removed.

8. At the end of the service, the Deacon's and Ushers will dismiss the Congregation by pews in an orderly manner.

9. Please do not congregate in the Narthex at the conclusion of the Service.

10. The following Sunday, June 21st, will be conducted with Holy Communion. The Deacon's are working on that Protocol to make that as safe as possible.

11. We will continue to evaluate the Protocol on a weekly basis.

12. If you are not feeling well, remember, the radio broadcast as well will be changed to Sunday mornings as well, broadcast at 8am.
