An update on the call process. Last Sunday a Joint Voter's Meeting was held at St. John's for the purpose of the Call Process. Members of St. John's and Immanuel Moltke were present, along with the Call Committee and Call Committee Chair Richard Lamb. Pastor Burhop was also in attendance.

The Call Committee had met March 22nd to make their recommendation on the 5 Pastors on the call list. Circumstances of the Covid guarantine then placed that process on hold until last Sunday. I am not a member of the Call Committee, however I did listen and observe the meeting. I can certainly testify that the members certainly did their homework on all 5 candidates, that was quite apparent. In the end, they ranked the 5 candidates 1-5. At the Joint Voters Meeting, the Voters voted unanimously to extend a Call to Pastor Todd Jerabek who is currently servicing 3 Parishes in Wisconsin. Zion/St. Peter in Embarrass, WI and St. John in Belle Plaine, WI. Pastor Burhop extended the Call and Pastor Jerabek stated he would consider the Call. Necessary documents and the packet will be mailed out today by the Call Committee. A list of the Candidates is in the Narthex for each of you to review. Just a note, the 5th Candidate, Pastor David Buss is no longer eligible on the list as we just learned he accepted another Call. I would like to extend the utmost gratitude to the Call Committee members for there dedication and commitment to reviewing all of the candidates. This is an update for now for those of you who were not able to attend the Joint Voters Meeting.
