Donut Day is October 15

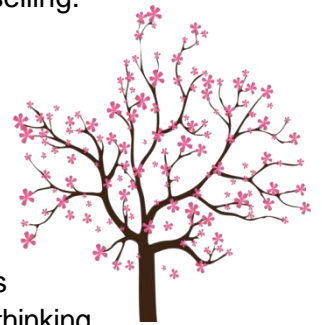
