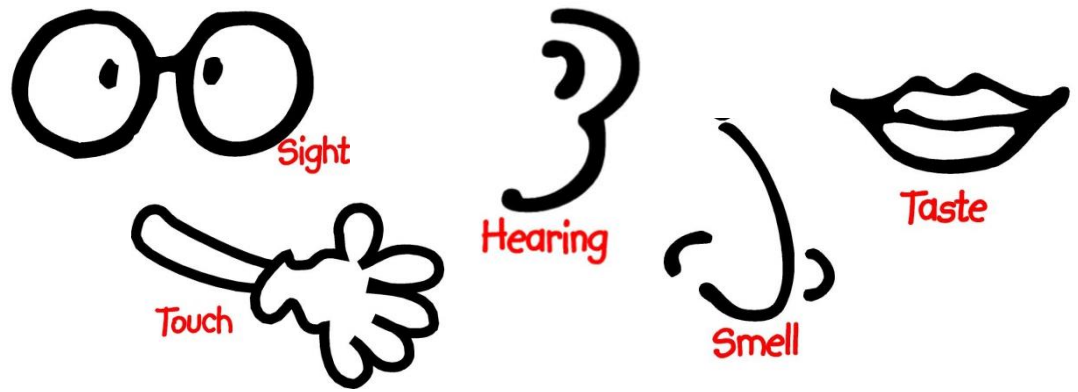

Last of the School Survey Results

- + 100% believe the school informs them about how their child is being graded.
- + 93.8% believe their child sees relationships between what is being taught and his/her everyday life. 6.2% said they're not sure.
- + 93.8% believe their child understands expectations for learning in each class. 6.2% said they're not sure.
- + 100% believe their child receives a variety of assessments to measure his/her understanding of what has been taught.
- + 87.5% believe the school has up to date computers and other technology that enhance learning. 12.5% said they're not sure.
