As an expression of our faith and fellowship as the Missouri Synod Lutherans we welcome to the Sacrament those baptized Christians who:

- confess and repent of their sins; believe in the Triune God, and in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior;
- believe that they receive Christ's true Body and Blood with the Bread and Wine for forgiveness of sins, new life and salvation;
- promise to change their sinful life with the help of the Holy Spirit. Oneness at the altar requires oneness in doctrine, faith, and life (Acts 2:42). Therefore, "Let each person examine himself, and thus eat of the bread and drink of the cup" (1 Corinthians 11:28)

Report from LWML Convention: It was truly gratifying to represent the Sonshine Zone of LWML at the National Convention in Lexington, KY in June. This convention was a little smaller than those of the past, because of Covid, with about 3,000 people present. All grants from the last biennium were paid for, plus about \$1,500 put towards the years 2021-2023. Our new biennium total is \$2,150,000 to pay for 28 new grants both here and abroad. We heard speakers, who benefited from this help in the past, and saw what they did to spread God's love.

Nearly 1,100 people partook in a mission pledge walk that raised \$96,232. A golf outing benefited \$30,710. Our first offering reached \$44,000 that went toward mites. There were three other offerings that went to others that needed help. In the past about 70% went to grants, but now 90% will.
