As an expression of our faith and fellowship as the Missouri Synod Lutherans we welcome to the Sacrament those baptized Christians who:

- confess and repent of their sins; believe in the Triune God, and in Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior;
- believe that they receive Christ's true Body and Blood with the Bread and Wine for forgiveness of sins, new life and salvation;
- promise to change their sinful life with the help of the Holy Spirit. Oneness at the altar requires oneness in doctrine, faith, and life (Acts 2:42). Therefore, "Let each person examine himself, and thus eat of the bread and drink of the cup" (1 Corinthians 11:28)



Can you imagine if you, as a child, had to leave the only home you ever knew with only the clothing on your back and whatever would fit into a trash bag?

This is why the Begin Again Backpack program exists. As children enter foster care they are often not allowed to bring their personal belongings with them. This can only add to the trauma that they are experiencing. It is our goal to alleviate the trauma and provide each foster child with a sense of belonging, stability and ownership. The aim of this program is to present every child that comes into foster care in the area with a backpack filled with toiletry, school and personal items that will help kease the transition process that they experience when moving from their biological home to a new foster home.

The School is collecting for backpacks. Bring donations to the school.
