Pastor Kersten: Hear the Word of God about the Pastoral Office.

John 20: 21-23

Again Jesus said, "Peace be with you! As the Father has sent me, I am sending you." And with that He breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive anyone's sins, their sins are forgiven; If you don not forgive them they are not forgiven."

1 Timothy 4:13-16

Until I come devote yourself to the public reading of Scripture, to preaching and to teaching. Do not neglect your gift, which was given through prophecy when the body of elders laid their hands on you. Be diligent in these matters; give yourself wholly to them, so that everyone may see your progress. Watch your life and doctrine closely. Persevere in them, because if you do, you will save both yourself and your hearers.

Pastor Kersten: Will you lead these people of God in giving faithful witness to the world and making known the love of God through loving service in this congregation?

Pastor Lemley: I will, and I ask God to help me.

Pastor Kersten: Almighty God, who has given you the will to do these things, give you the power of His Spirit so that you may perform them with strength and compassion. All God's people said AMEN.
